13th biannual Eye Camp under Dr. Mathra Das Pahwa Vision Outreach Program was organised at Mathra Das Civil Hospital at Moga, Punjab on Sunday 3rd December, 2023. It was jointly inaugurated by Ms. Anandita Pahwa, Head-CSR, Pahwa Group and Mr. Sanjeev Saini, Chairman, Blooming Buds School, Moga in the presence of Mrs. Indu Puri, an eminent Social Worker of Moga. Underprivileged and needy people visited the eye camp from urban Moga as well as from villages of Moga. More than 700 people have registered in the camp, 104 Cataract patients have been give dates for cataract surgeries. The cataract surgeries will be performed at Mathra Das Civil Hospital free of Cost. 1455 eye drops and 303 spectacles were provided to the needy patients.

As a step towards empowering them, DRI is providing financial support and equipment such as beautician chair, pedicure tub, mirror, steamer, pressing machine, manicure and pedicure kit for beauty parlours, and tailoring kit and sewing machine for tailoring boutiques; so that these girls can set up their own small businesses.
